

TAP Work Plan 2016

The TAP Work Plan 2016 is articulated around four main sets of activities. Activities to be carried out in 2016 for each of them are briefly described and then presented in a summary table making reference to their contribution to the outputs of the TAP Action Plan 2013 – 2017 endorsed by the 1st Partner Assembly in September 2013. The four sets of activities are:

- ➤ Facilitation and Governance
- > Outreach, Framework Dissemination and Global Policy Dialogue
- Resource Mobilization
- Country Action

1. TAP Facilitation and Governance

The TAP Secretariat will continue to play its facilitation role for TAP, while the TAP Steering Committee (SC) and the TAP Partner Assembly will ensure governance of the Platform. After the virtual Partner Assembly in 2014 and the face-to-face Partner Assembly of January 2016 in Rwanda, another virtual Partner Assembly will most probably be scheduled for December 2016.

The described activities contribute to following outcome / output of the TAP Action Plan:

Outcome 4: TAP contribution to development of tropical AIS delivered.

Output 4.1: TAP governance and secretariat developed.

2. Outreach, Framework Dissemination and Global Policy Dialogue

As laid out in the 2015 Annual Report, the TAP Common Framework on Capacity Development (CD) for Agricultural Innovation Systems (AIS) was developed by a team of consultants with the inputs of experts of TAP Partners, the TAP Global Task Force and the TAP Secretariat. The TAP Global Task Force endorsed the Framework in December 2015 on a non-objection basis. There are three core documents related to the TAP Framework, which will be finalized in early 2016:

- Conceptual Background
- Guidance Note on Operationalization
- Synthesis Document

In addition, learning and outreach material will be produced to further raise awareness of the Framework, advocate for its wide adoption and promote its use. The advocacy material for TAP will be updated. The following outputs will be delivered:

- Toolbox (based on Guidance Note On Operationalization)
- Learning modules (based on Guidance Note On Operationalization)
- Framework Flyer (1 page A5)
- Revised Framework brochure (4 pages A4)
- Revised TAP Flyer (1 page A5)

TAP Partners are encouraged to use the outreach material to advocate for the TAP Framework.



The TAP website in its current form will be discontinued in 2016 due to the fact that separate domains on the FAO server, such as www.tropagplatform.org, are no longer supported. The web presence of TAP website will be maintained as follows:

- Basic information on TAP, such as news and key documents, will be moved to a dedicated webpage on the FAO website (www.fao.org/tropagplatform). This page will be created by FAO's IT services in 2016 and comply with FAO's corporate communication requirements. All TAP Partners will be duly acknowledged on the webpage.
- TAPipedia, which will be hosted on the GFAR server, will contain the majority of TAP-related content, i.e. CD for AIS resources of TAP Partners (reports, guidelines, case studies, etc.), contents of the TAP Framework, inventory of tools, etc. AgroKnow, the contracted IT service provider, will continue the development of TAPipedia in 2016 and will transform its current α-version into a fully operational knowledge sharing hub. The TAP Secretariat will supervise the TAPipedia development and the TAP Steering Committee will review progress at its meetings. TAP Partners will be required to upload and share their CD for AIS material, such as methodologies and approaches, case studies and good practices, etc.

In June 2015, the United States of America and Brazil agreed to jointly promote the implementation of the Post-2015 Development Agenda Sustainable Development Goal on food security, nutrition, and sustainable agriculture by working bilaterally and through the United Nations. To fulfil this pledge, the two countries decided to work together via the FAO-hosted Tropical Agriculture Platform (TAP) on improving nutrition by promoting innovation in agriculture.

Through the organisation of an international e-consultation in April 2016 and subsequent symposium at FAO headquarters in June 2016, the US – Brazil – TAP joint conference will bring together the issues of capacity development, agricultural innovation and food security and nutrition and develop recommendations on a consistent approach for policy-making. The TAP Common Framework on Capacity Development for Agricultural Innovation Systems will be used as the conceptual and methodological basis for the conference and customised material on applying the Framework to Food Security and Nutrition, while promoting sustainable agriculture, will be developed. The proposed action should deliver evidence in how far generic principles of capacity development for agricultural innovation can be applied and in how far tailored solutions are required.

In conjunction with the Partner Assembly in January 2016 a cross-country exchange is organized to share and learn from the initial experiences that have been gained in some of the CDAIS pilot countries, regarding, among other things, the scoping studies, the inception workshops and the use of the principles and tools of the TAP Framework. Opportunities for potential collaboration among the pilot countries and TAP Partner organizations as well as the integration of CD for AIS aspects into national policies can be explored and identified. The outcomes will be useful inputs for the policy roundtables in the eight pilot countries that will happen throughout 2016. TAP Partners are encouraged to participate in the TAP Policy Dialogue activities of 2016 and provide linkages to their ongoing work on CD for AIS policies.

In 2015 collaboration between TAP and the Regional Fora, in particular with the Asia-Pacific





Association of Agricultural Research Institutions, has started on the promotion of the TAP Framework. This collaboration should be intensified in 2016 with other fora being supported financially for their efforts in promoting the CD for AIS principles and approaches developed under TAP. Whenever possible, regional events organized by other institutions will be used to present TAP and the Common Framework and to distribute customized outreach material. Ad hoc specific regional events will be organized when necessary.

The described activities contribute to following outcomes / outputs of the TAP Action Plan:

Outcome 1: CD needs and supplies of AIS in tropical countries are defined accurately through inclusive country-led multi-stakeholder processes leading to more demand-driven and efficient CD interventions.

Output 1.2: TAP Tool Box and application guidelines developed for assessment of capacities, current and future needs in national AIS.

Outcome 2: Capacity development interventions in tropical AIS that are better integrated with each other, that are more focused on development of institutional and organizational capacities and that include the private sector.

Output 2.1: TAP partners and other stakeholders share a common vision on capacity development in AIS with regard to improving their investment strategies (int. level).

Outcome 3: Political mechanisms established in consultation with broader stakeholders to improve coordination between interventions in capacity development in tropical AIS.

Output 3.1: TAP Framework supported by G20 and other international mechanisms.

Outcome 4: TAP contribution to development of tropical AIS delivered.

Output 4.1: TAP governance and secretariat developed.

3. Resource Mobilization

Resources for TAP have been successfully mobilized in 2014 through the Capacity Development for Agricultural Innovation Systems (CDAIS) project funded by the European Union from 2015 to 2018. While the project provides funding for part of the activities of the TAP Action Plan, the TAP Secretariat and the TAP Chair will explore further opportunities for financing the Action Plan and for TAP-related activities, such as the use of the Framework on CD for AIS beyond the eight pilot countries of the CDAIS project. TAP Partners are encouraged to fund additional activities in 2016 that were identified in the original TAP Action Plan. Fundraising activities can be based on the TAP Trust Fund established by FAO.

The Integrated International Investment Facility for Agricultural Innovation and Growth will be further developed in 2016 by GFAR and IFAD. Once the Facility will be funded, TAP will provide support to its establishment and implementation.

The described activities contribute to following outcomes / outputs of the TAP Action Plan:

Outcome 4: TAP contribution to development of tropical AIS delivered.

Output 4.1: TAP governance and secretariat developed.



4. Country Action

The country action foreseen in the 2016 work plan will be financed by the CDAIS project. The project is implemented by AGRINATURA and FAO to support the implementation of the TAP Action Plan, especially the validation of the TAP Framework. For the project, eight pilot countries have been selected: Angola, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia and Rwanda in Africa, Bangladesh and Laos in Asia and Guatemala and Honduras in Latin America.

In four pilot countries inception workshops were held in 2015, another four workshops will be held in early 2016 in order to obtain the buy-in of governments and other stakeholders in the country, to raise awareness about the CDAIS project and to identify possible areas for intervention, such as innovation niches and value chains. Subsequent to the inception workshops, needs assessments will be carried out in the eight CDAIS pilot countries in 2016, which will lead to the formulation of CD intervention plans. In that context, a policy roundtable as well as a marketplace will be organized in each country by the TAP Secretariat in collaboration with FAO country offices to support the development of a national vision for CD for AIS and to bring together organizations with a need for stronger capacities and organizations that can provide capacity development.

The described activities contribute to following outcomes / outputs of the TAP Action Plan:

Outcome 1: CD needs and supplies of AIS in tropical countries are defined accurately through inclusive country-led multi-stakeholder processes leading to more demand-driven and efficient CD interventions.

- Output 1.3: Country-led multi-stakeholder assessments of capacities and needs supported, and potential solutions identified.
- Outcome 2: Capacity development interventions in tropical AIS that are better integrated with each other, that are more focused on development of institutional and organizational capacities and that include the private sector.
 - Output 2.2: Country-based mechanisms and platforms for inclusive advocacy, multistakeholder dialogue, coordination, and action on AIS capacity strengthened by TAP (country/sub-regional level).
- Outcome 3: Political mechanisms established in consultation with broader stakeholders to improve coordination between interventions in capacity development in tropical AIS.
